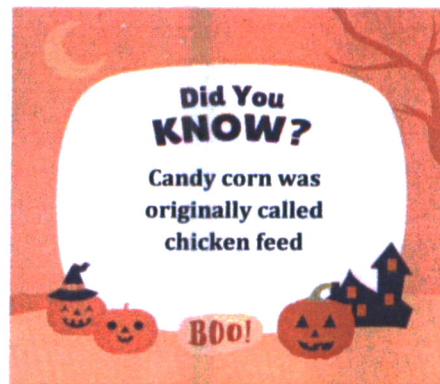

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FRESH START

Monthly Program Highlight

Fresh Start is a spinoff of our previous OPIOID-3 program. JCCAC will provide a full array of workforce services to eligible participants who disclose that they have been impacted by the opioid crisis, to reintegrate them into the workforce. Individuals eligible to receive Fresh Start Grant services must be one of the following:

1. A dislocated worker,
2. An individual temporarily or permanently laid off as a consequence of the opioid emergency,
3. A long-term unemployed individual; or
4. A self-employed individual who became unemployed or significantly underemployed as a result of the opioid crisis.

The eligible individuals are not required to have a history of opioid use disorder to qualify for Fresh Start Grant services and cannot be required to disclose whether they have been impacted by the opioid crisis as a condition of participation. However, to target services to individuals impacted by opioid use disorder and to make appropriate referrals, local areas, may only ask applicants or participants the following optional question:

Your answer to this question is voluntary. Do you, a friend, or any member of your family have a history of opioid use? Please answer "Yes," or "No."
